EARA'S MISSION:

EARA fulfills this mission by providing experiential programs at public schools (Benton, Cabot, Conway, Vilonia and Little Rock), State Parks (Woolly Hollow, Parkin Archeological Park, Prairie Grove, Old Washington and Petit Jean Mountain), Federal Parks (Arkansas Post and Cadron Settlement) and driven to provide a hands on experience for the general public using experiential archeology and living history demonstrations that include: ox driving, food preparation, clothing styles and manufacturing, log house building and shingle making, spinning, weaving and knitting, natural dying, early lighting, furniture making, games and recreation, storytelling, early occupations and other various cultural aspects of early Arkansas life.

EARA's membership is made up of people in Arkansas and several other states, many who enjoy depicting early everyday life of common people. Often, much time and expense as well as energy and research go into creating an individual's character. Some members are just starting to develop personas, while others have been working on theirs for many years. Members continue to research, learn and share in the old ways. Some members, such as park and museum interpreters, present demonstrations almost daily. Members try to provide visual impact through period correct clothing, accouterments and tools.
